d) Hoardings & Participation in Educational Fairs

The University participates in Education Fairs at National & International Level to give information about admissions to prospective candidates.

Selection Process

The admission to all the programmes are made on merit determined on the basis of score in qualifying examination, entrance test and interview. To be specific the selection process for different programmes is as under:

1) School of Technology

Admission is allowed in B.Tech. Programme based on PCM score (min. 50% for B.Tech.), JEE Score & Interview. For Diploma, X or equivalent passed with a minimum of 45% marks

2) School of Business

Admissions to UG Programmes are made based on merit in the qualifying examination and interview (min. 45%).

Admission to MBA is given on the Entrance Test Score of MAT/CAT along with min. 50% marks in graduation followed by G.D./P.I.

Admission to Ph.D. Programme are made on the basis of Entrance Test followed by interview-cum-presentation on the proposed research topic. The UGC guidelines are followed for admission to Ph.D. programme.

3) School of Media Studies & Design

Admission to UG Programme (min. 50%) are made on merit drawn on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination and above.

4) School of Graduate Studies

The admissions to BA (Honours) - Economics programme is given on the basis of marks (min. 50%) in qualifying examination & interview.

5) School of Graduate Studies

The admissions to B.Sc. (H) Chemistry, B.Sc. (H) Maths, B.Sc. (H) Physics (min. 50%), B.Com. (min. 45%) & B.Com. (Honors) (min. 50%) programmes are given on the basis of marks in qualifying examination & interview.
