The choice based credit system provides flexibility in the choice of courses and credits. Under CBCS to make education more interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary, the University has defined its Academic System which provides freedom of choice in courses & credits. The courses are classified into Open Core, Program Core, Program Elective, Open Elective, VAPs, Passion Programs (PROPs). The students have the choice to opt open electives from other disciplines.</p> <p>The Academic System document is enclosed as at Annexure 'E'</p>

The students regularly undertake extra-curricular and co-curricular activities which include industry projects, internships, field works, seminars, workshops, summer training, group discussions, role playing etc. In all the UG Degree programmes, the University offers credit based Value Added Programs (VAPs) for additional value addition to the students. The University is offering students to take minor specialization which are interdisciplinary in nature.</p> <p>In B.Tech. Programme, there is a provision for industrial training during summer vacation after 4th & 6th Semesters and for complete 8th Semester. In all other programmes, there is a provision for internship during summer vacation.</p> <p>In MBA, there is a provision for compulsory internship of 6 to 8 weeks after 2nd Semester.</p>

The University follows Continuous Performance Evaluation System, which is customized to effectively assess & evaluate student's performance on the basis of learning outcomes of the courses (CO).

The University follows two modes of examination, viz:

- i) Formative Evaluation, which includes internal sessional exam evaluation held during the semester & other class room activities including seminars, presentations, lab practical etc.
- ii) Summative Evaluation which consists of End Term Examination held at the end of each semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for that semester.

In addition, the evaluation for industrial training is based on work carried out & subsequent presentation.

As an innovative step in evaluation, the University follows 10 Point grading system for conversion of marks obtained into letter grades and converting letter grades to Grade Points.

The end semester examination consists of 60% components for all courses in the University. The question papers are generated by software from the question bank created through questions from internal & external examiners. The answer scripts are coded through a bar code generated system. The University adopts the system of central evaluation of coded answer sheets. The examiners including External Examiners, Head Examiners, Examiners & Scrutinizers are appointed to cross verify the proper evaluation. The final decoding is completely based on the Bar Code .

There is internal choice unit-wise ensuring the student reads & attempts the complete syllabus.
